Thomas Edison Lab & Mansion Tour

Back by popular request. This tour was oversold at the 2002 CTCI International Convention. For more than forty years, the laboratory created by Thomas Alva Edison in West Orange, NJ had enormous impact on the lives of millions of people worldwide. Out of the West Orange laboratories came the motion picture camera, vastly improved phonographs & sound recordings, silent & sound movies, and the nickel-iron alkaline electric storage battery. Edison National Historic Site includes Edison's labs, offices, and the "Black Maria" (the first film studio). It provides a unique opportunity to experience important aspects of America's industrial, social and economic past, and to learn from the legacy of the world's best known inventor.

You will also have the opportunity to visit Thomas Edison's home. Glenmont is a 23 room Queen Anne-style mansion, containing many of the original furnishings. It is located just minutes from Edison's Lab on 15.5 acres in Llewellyn Park, America's first private, romantically landscaped, residential area (founded in 1857). It was the home of Thomas Edison and his wife from 1886 to 1931, and it is their final resting place. Both Mr. and Mrs. Edison are buried behind the house.

"Mama Said" also led by Ms. Reeves was used in a major promotional campaign for Pepto Bismol. She also has a Wendy's commercial in her long list of achievements, as well as one of the first Rock n Roll Coca-Cola commercials. Ms. Reeves also co-starred in the Rock n Roll film with the Shirelles "Let The Good Times Roll". "Tonight's the Night" penned by Ms. Reeves, "Baby It's You" lead vocal by Ms. Reeves along with the soulful sounding "This Is Dedicated To The One I Love" are all time Shirelle Favorites. The greatest hit song enjoyed by the group is "Soldier Boy". This particular song touched so many lives and hearts. Shirley Alston Reeves is loved by all who have had the pleasure of meeting and hearing her golden vocals. Her show is designed to please even the toughest musical appetites!! New York City Tour

"Top Of The Rock"

Top of the Rock is a 55,000 square-foot, six-level complex that, for the first time in 20 years, offers visitors an unparalleled experience from which to enjoy vast, 360-degree views of New York City. The observation deck is atop the Art Deco skyscraper, 30 Rockefeller Plaza. Views include some of the city's most prominent landmarks from the Chrysler Building to the Brooklyn Bridge and from Central Park to the Hudson and East Rivers. There is a multi-media exhibit on the history of Rockefeller Center featuring contemporary plasma screens alongside an original basswood model of 30 Rockefeller Plaza. Sky shuttle elevators have projections on the glass ceiling showing images from 1930s through present day, symbolizing the passage of time, as they transport visitors to the deck. Completely indoor viewing areas with floor to ceiling windows. Brand new, transparent safety glass panels allow completely unobstructed open-air views and protection from the elements. The observation deck was first opened to the public in 1933 and was originally designed to evoke the upper decks of a 1930s grand ocean liner, outfitted with deck chairs, gooseneck fixtures, and large air conditioning vents intended to look like the stacks on a ship's deck. It was closed to the public in 1986, and was restored and reopened in 2005. Reserved-time tickets are used to minimize long lines and large crowds.

Radio City Music Hall Backstage Tour

Back by popular request. For those who didn't go on the New York tour at the 2002 CTCI International Convention, or who took the New York tour without the Backstage tour at Radio City Music Hall. The guided tour takes you behind the scenes at America's greatest showplace! Tour guides will lead you on a fascinating journey through one of New York's most spectacular landmark buildings. Come learn about the technological marvels of the Great Stage (one of the largest indoor performance stages in the world) and its amazing hydraulic system, see the mighty Wurlitzer Organ, the vast art collection and Art Deco designs, visit the active rehearsal halls, and top it all off by meeting one of the world-famous Radio City Rockettes!

NBC Studio Tour

Since 1933, NBC has offered this historic tour that takes you into the studios of NBC's New York operations. An NBC Page will be your guide to the world of the Peacock Network. The first stop on the tour is the NBC/ Sharp History Theatre, where you will learn about NBC's early days in radio. The globe-shaped theater is home to a 16' x 9' foot high-definition screen and is equipped with surround sound. You will learn about some of the network's early sound effect techniques and NBC's transition into television. After learning about NBC's past, you will have the opportunity to enter and visit three or four of the most famous NBC studios (The Today Show, Dateline NBC, NBC Nightly News, Late Night with Conan O'Brien, and Saturday Night Live). After visiting some of these studios, you will visit the Television Operating Center to learn about the company's operations. Then it's on to the Tour Make-up Room where guests have the chance to learn about television make-up and view examples of prosthetic pieces built for Saturday Night Live and Late Night with Conan O'Brien. The final stop is in the High Definition Mini Control Studio. Each guest will have their photo taken at our News Desk, the Pages will explain how a real control room works, and two volunteers will be chosen to read the news and give a weather demonstration!

In addition to the three tours, there will be some time for you to explore Rockefeller Center, or St. Patrick's Cathedral, or one of the other attractions within walking distance. Lunch is on your own.
